Important Child Safeguarding Information

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At the top of each school's landing page you will see this 'Click CEOP' button which will lead you to step 2.

Once you have clicked the button at the top of the page, you will see a confidential reporting system, should you have any concerns regarding a child's safety online. If you scroll down the page you'll get to step 3.

There is a wealth of child-friendly advice for staying safe online which is age appropriate - perfectly OK for your child to watch and use with you present, to help explain the important messages.

The National Crime Agency is a Government organisation set up to tackle all sorts of crime - in this particular case the exploitation of children online. As a parent it can sometimes feel like a minefield of conflicting information about keeping your child safe online - this really is a one-stop shop.




MIJS Mathemagician Morning

In Rainbow class this week....

We have been busy making potions, writing recipes and having fun with monster slime! The children have been exploring capacity and have had lots of fun! As this is our last term in Reception we need to start preparing the children for Year 1. After the May bank holiday please could you start encouraging your children to come into the classroom by themselves from the Reception gate. This is to help with your child's independence. We will still have 'Show and Tell' on a Thursday morning and you are welcome to come and talk to us if you need to.. We will encourage the children to come in by themselves too and hopefully after half term the children will be used to the new routine and proud of themselves for being so grown up. Thank you.



In 100 Acre Wood class this week....

We have been busy reading more of our Class book and learning all about the wonderful animals that live on the Savannah. This has linked really nicely with our Science Topic and we have been grouping animals and discussing if they are mammals, amphibians, reptiles etc. We have also been discussing if the animals are carnivores, herbivores or omnivores. In maths we have been concentrating on our number bonds to 10 and representing these using ten frames, the part part whole method and using tens and ones. We then used this knowledge to solve problems. The children continue to have loads of fun learning the recorders!




In Neverland class this week....

In English, we have finished and been writing up our fabulous safari travel journals. In maths, we've been developing our strategies for solving word problems and missing number problems.

Last Friday in science, we set up some 'beans in bags' and taped them to the window so we can watch our bean seeds germinate. We also created some great poster designs for staying safe and away from building sites.

In Wonderland class this week....

In Wonderland Class we have continued with our Wizarding Subjects. We are entering our Fantastic Beasts poems into a poetry competition!

We have also continued our work on measurement, and have used our measuring skills to make our own slime potions.

We have also begun our Quidditch Tournament in PE. So far Hufflepuff and Ravenclaw are in the lead, but can they hold onto it as our skills develop?

In Willows class this week....

We have been learning about the properties of 2D shapes- which was a big jump from year 3, as we have learnt all the different types of triangles and quadrilaterals - ask us their names! Our book of Hugo has got exciting and we have used new skills to create artworks on the ipads of a Parisian train station.

In science, our electricity topic has been continuing and we have learnt about switches so that hopefully we can design some. This week's homework is all about animals in French - please get the children to teach you the names they've learnt and help them create sentences to write - they don't have to be true - the crazier the better!



In Rivendell class this week....

In Rivendell class this week we have been looking at 2D shapes and have begun to use protractors to measure and investigate the interior angles. We have been completing our stories based on Kensuke's Kingdom and have written-up poems for our school poetry book. Maths homework will be sent this week. Children should complete pages 56, 57, 64 and 65 to recap what we have been doing over the past fortnight. In Science we have begun to look at Earth and Space and have been discussing how direct and indirect evidence affects how people have viewed the Earth, Sun and Moon.



In Cawdor class this week....

This week we have started our art and Food technology projects. Half the class have been learning how colour, flavour and smell affect our perception of foods, while the other half have been exploring portrait techniques.

SATs week commences on 14th May. All children are invited to come into school from 8:30 am onwards for a complimentary breakfast. Children should have brought home a letter to explain these arrangements.

Earrings **MUST** be removed for all swimming session as well as PE sessions which include contact sport and equipment. Earrings cannot be taped as this will not prevent an accident. We kindly ask that if you are planning on allowing your child to have their ears pierced that this is left to the beginning of the summer holiday, giving them time to heal so they can be removed.

Children must remove their earrings **independently** and have a pot to store them in during PE and swimming sessions.

We encourage children to take their earrings out at home on PE and swimming days.

Active Learning

2. Measure the perimeter of your course.
3. Jog around it 10 times.
4. Calculate how far you have jogged in total.

You can challenge yourself by

Write your course perimeter and jogging distance in metres and cm. So if the course was 400cm + 350cm + 350 cm + 400cm, this would equal 1500cm, which is also 15m.
