What we do well?	What could we do even better?
Including family in extra activity e.g. poppy making, Macmillan Coffee Morning, Harvest Festival, Movie night and Christmas.	Encourage children to drink more.
Organise lots of activities and information sessions in and out of school hours for parents to attend particularly as my daughter has only just started at school. It's been really nice to have the opportunity to feel involved in her school life and see how she learns in school.	The amount of letters sent home is rather overwhelming especially if this is your first child at the school. Maybe in the future parents could state their preferences i.e. email etc or text. It would save a few trees too as a lot of the correspondence is duplicated.
Encourage the children to be positive, independent and creative.	He needs to improve on subtracting and counting backwards.
Maths because he is very good at addition and counting forwards.	Individual class assemblies for big events such as Harvest, Mothers/Fathers Day. Termly report cards.
Ensure every child's individual need is met. Offer support for the whole family, not just the child. Always available to listen to concerns without hesitation. Amazing opportunities given to all children - poppies, boogie bounce.	Not related to the educational side of things - The use of lockers is great, but the children need somewhere to hang wet coats. Currently putting in lockers.
Children's individual needs are seriously taken into account. Extremely supportive network within the school.	You could do more evening activities like bingo night, cinema at school, disco for kids, they will be so happy. Halloween party.
You do everything right. Kids are safe. They are happy with everything what you doing.	I enjoyed (a couple of years ago) going into reception class on a Friday morning so children could share work. It is more difficult to achieve this with the after school slot. Maybe have 2 times a week - options for parents.
My child has shown clear progress in settling in to reception class and has shown at home what they are learning each week. Great activities offered - movie night, poppies making, reading cafe.	This is just an idea but I have 2 siblings in the school and just wondered if it was possible for these parents to receive 1 set of paperwork when the general infant info is sent out. Would save a lot of paper and I know they have been talking lots in reception about recycling! I understand this may be difficult to carry out.
Lots of activities and opportunities for children - clubs, movie night, clay poppies, reading cafe. Clearly school is a positive experience with good learning environment as my child will come home and tell us what she has been learning about.	Perhaps more info on how my child is progressing. I feel she must be doing OK as I don't hear anything. There is no real homework given - apart from spellings. This must be new approach?

Overall a very positive set of survey results even though from a relatively small number of returned surveys.
