### Get cooking!

Hurrah!!! Two of the children at Bacton Primary School have shared a recipe that they love. Their names are Emme and Millie and their recipe is for rock cakes. YUMMY! Why not have a go at making them for yourself over the half term holiday. Here's how to do it...

Ingredients:  
200g self raising flour  
100g raisins  
50g caster sugar  
50g butter  
75ml milk  
1/2 tsp baking powder  
1/4 tsp salt

Preheat oven to 210C and prepare and measure ingredients.  
Mix flour, baking powder, sugar and salt. Add butter cut into pieces.  
Crush using fingertips until crumbly.  
Pour in the milk and add the raisins, then mix until the dough is consistent.  
If it is too dry add a little more milk, if too sticky add a sprinkle of flour.  
Place dough on a floured surface and roll to thickness of 1cm.  
Cut into 5cm discs using a cookie cutter.  
Coat the tops with a little milk and bake for 12 mins on baking paper.  
Once cooked remove and cool on wire rack.

**From 10:30 am - The Leas Gardens**  
Visit the Viking Village to see how life might have been in Sheringham a thousand years ago. Talk to our Vikings about their clothing, weapons and daily life. Warm yourself by their fire-pits. See demonstrations of battle techniques and Viking weaponry. Try axe-throwing! Watch as the Viking blacksmith produces items from iron on his working forge. See a Viking loom in action. Buy their carefully crafted wares. Some of our Vikings will be around the town during the day. Don't be afraid to approach them! They'll be happy to talk to you.

**2:15 pm - Battle on The Beach**  
Follow the Vikings as they march along the seaboard to the East Beach for a mighty battle. Cheer on your favourites as they fight in front of the Viking Longship as Scira defends Sheringham against his enemies.

**3:30 pm - The Leas Gardens**  
Our Vikings return to their village. Visit them for more demonstrations. Try on their helmets for size and see if you can hold a Viking sword or shield. Talk to the mighty Shield Makers about their role in battle and their use of weapons. Ask them about the old Norse Gods.

**5:00 pm - The March**  
As our Vikings march to the top of the town for the procession, plan your viewpoint for the Grande Finale. Follow the Viking route or take your position at The Leas to await the arrival of the honour guard and the longboat.

**5:15pm - Fire! Grand Finale**  
Watch the torchlight procession through the town or remain in prime position at The Leas to be entertained by the fire-performers of the amazing Unhinged Circus on the beach as they breathe fire into the darkening skies amidst ceremonial bonfires.

**5:45pm - Boat Burning Site**  
As the honour guard arrive with blazing torches to await the 28 ft longboat, have your cameras ready for the spectacular, ceremonial burning of the boat as the Vikings send their king to Valhalla.
